

I. Situational Analysis



LCHI operates within a strong environment supported by UL Lafayette's R1 research capabilities.

Our internal strengths include a robust network of academic partnerships, experienced faculty and staff, and a growing alignment with state and national healthcare goals.

However, we need a broader alignment between academic research and industry needs and a more diverse funding mechanism for longterm sustainability.

This offers opportunities to expand our focus on interdisciplinary collaboration and health innovation, addressing the growing demand for healthcare and life sciences professionals in Louisiana and beyond.



The healthcare landscape continues to evolve, with an increasing focus on biotechnology, digital health, public health informatics, and data-driven healthcare solutions.

Louisiana faces challenges in healthcare access, health outcomes, and workforce shortages. National and state initiatives emphasize the importance of health informatics, workforce development, and strategic healthcare delivery.

LCHI is uniquely positioned to lead research and community initiatives that respond to these external pressures and opportunities.

II. Strategic Goals and Milestones

Goal 1: Advance Health Innovation



LCHI is focused on pioneering research and innovation in healthcare and life sciences, emphasizing health informatics and public health.

- Health Informatics Research: Lead research initiatives that explore the use of data analytics, AI, and machine learning to improve healthcare delivery, patient outcomes, and public health decision-making.
- Public Health Innovation: Develop projects that apply informatics and technology to address public health challenges, including disease surveillance, and population health management.
- Collaborative Research Models: Engage in interdisciplinary collaborations across academic units, industry, and government to co-create healthcare innovations that can be translated into practice.

Milestones:



Initiate three key research projects focused on health informatics and public health by the end of 2025.



Secure partnerships with five research institutions and healthcare providers by the end of 2026 to support collaborative research.



Publish research findings that contribute to national discussions on improving health outcomes and data-driven solutions by 2027.

Goal 2: Enhance Strategic Workforce Development



While LCHI does not directly offer academic programs, we play a critical role in supporting the development of a skilled healthcare workforce by fostering collaborations and research that inform educational practices.

- Workforce Development Research: Conduct research that identifies workforce gaps in the healthcare and life sciences sectors, providing data-driven insights to shape state and national workforce policies.
- Collaboration with Academic Units: Work closely with UL Lafayette's academic programs and external institutions to align research with healthcare career pathways and workforce development initiatives.
- Industry and Government Partnerships: Collaborate with industry stakeholders, government agencies, and educational institutions to develop frameworks that address Louisiana's healthcare workforce needs.

Milestones:



Complete a statewide workforce needs assessment for the healthcare sector by 2025.



Develop reports and recommendations for Louisiana's healthcare workforce strategy by 2026.



Build partnerships with industry stakeholders to support healthcare workforce innovation by 2027.

Goal 3: Expand Community Engagement and Impact



LCHI's role in community engagement is integral to improving healthcare access and outcomes across Louisiana.

- Community-Based Research Initiatives: Participate in and lead research and community engagement efforts to assess and address healthcare needs, ensuring competent solutions.
- Public Health Informatics in the Community: Utilize public health informatics to gather data, monitor health trends, and develop targeted interventions that improve community health outcomes.
- Stakeholder Collaborations: Work with community organizations, local healthcare providers, and public health agencies to implement research findings that promote community wellness.

Milestones:



Engage with three community organizations to develop health informatics-driven projects by the end of 2025.



Develop a dashboard by the end of 2026 to guide community organizations, local healthcare providers, and public health agencies.



Conduct/assist with annual community health fairs and workshops that provide education and resources starting in 2025.

Goal 4: Strengthen Institutional Capacity in Research and Collaboration



To meet our mission, LCHI will continue to enhance its research capacity, infrastructure, and partnerships, creating a sustainable foundation for health innovation.

- Interdisciplinary Research Collaborations: Facilitate research partnerships within UL Lafayette and other research centers to foster interdisciplinary work in healthcare innovation, public health, and health informatics.
- Grant Funding and External Support: Pursue funding from national and state agencies, philanthropic organizations, and private sector partners to support LCHI's long-term research agenda.
- Capacity Building for Health Innovation: Expand LCHI's infrastructure to support research in emerging areas like biotechnology, biomanufacturing, and public health informatics.

Milestones:



Secure \$3 million in funding by 2027 to support interdisciplinary research and health informatics projects.



Develop a robust research agenda at UL Lafayette for health informatics and public health innovation by 2027.



Create three strategic partnerships with national research institutions by 2026 to expand research opportunities.

Goal 5: Improve Healthcare Outcomes Through Research and Policy Influence



LCHI is committed to improving health results through research, partnerships, and advocacy. We will use data and research to inform policy and improve access to heathcare in Louisiana and beyond.

- Research on Social Determinants of Health: Conduct research that explores the root causes of varying health results and offers data-driven solutions for policymakers, healthcare providers, and community leaders.
- Health Policy Advocacy: Use research findings to advocate for policies that address social determinants of health and improve healthcare access and outcomes.
- Community-Centered Solutions: Ensure that research and policy recommendations are grounded in the needs of the communities we serve for competent and effective healthcare practices.

Milestones:



Publish two major research studies on health outcomes and social determinants of health by 2026.



Engage with state health policymakers to implement recommendations from LCHI's research by 2027.



Organize/participate in annual stakeholder roundtables on health data to facilitate cross-sector collaboration by 2026.

Action Steps

Assign Responsibilities

Assign responsibility to each team member for each strategic goal, ensuring clear accountability and progress tracking.

Cross-Functional Teams

To advance each goal, form cross-disciplinary teams of researchers, community stakeholders, and healthcare professionals.

Regular Progress Reviews

Schedule quarterly reviews to evaluate progress on key milestones and adapt strategies as needed.

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)

- Partnerships developed with healthcare providers, academic institutions, and community organizations.
- Number of health informatics and public health research projects initiated.
- Measurable impact on community health outcomes.
